Does Hollywood, Florida Need a City Auditor?

At the Hollywood City Commission meeting on March 16th, the agenda item that preceded the Hillcrest Redevelopment and took up so much time, was a discussion on the possibility of hiring an internal City Auditor. It was a very interesting couple of hours. As we all know, Hollywood has had some financial problems in the past where the City Commission was kept in the dark by the City Manager about budgetary issues until too late. Although Mayor Bober is not seeking reelection, he wanted to present the idea as a preventive measure going forward by adding this extra layer of checks and balances to the current system. As it is now, we have a City Manager and City Attorney that are hired by and report to the Mayor and City Commission.

In the past, we have had two City Managers who did not advise the Commission about serous budgetary problems until it was too late. Just recently we

found out that 973K was spent on temporary City workers that was never approved by the City Commission. The City Manager has since resigned and taken a position elsewhere. After a tumultuous few years, we are now on our

"Hopefully, **ALL** the Commissioners do their homework before the next meeting and vote to allow the people of this city to decide for ourselves in November whether or not we want a City Auditor to watch over our budget."

in my mind, it is best to implement a new idea when all is going well and not when we are under duress. Currently we have one of the best City Attorneys around, Jeff Sheffel, who I have known and admired for years. Anyone who has met and spoken with our new City Manager, Dr. Wazir Ishmael may very well agree that he is going to be the guy we wished we had 10 years ago. Dr. Ismael is intelligent, proactive, ethical and professional.

And there's the rub. I am told that City Attorneys and City Managers rarely take kindly to the idea of a City Auditor because it takes away some of their power and responsibilities. I cannot speak for Mr. Sheffel or Dr. Ishmael but I cannot see either one of these gentlemen thinking that way. If they are against the idea, I am sure their reasons are more practical and not self-serving. But I really do not know what they think because I did not ask them.

What I actually heard was the Mayor and City Auditor from Fort Lauderdale, who were invited by Mayor Bober, taking questions and answering why

the previous agenda item was scheduled at 4 PM that the redevelopment issue would come up about 5 PM; but we had to wait until almost 6:30PM because the 4PM agenda item ran over. It proved to be very interesting. For details, see page 3.

As far as the Redevelopment issue went, several building presidents showed up and got up to speak in favor of the project. The attorney for the "opposition" attended and in about three sentences announced that the lawsuit had been settled. The attorney for the developer showed us a few more improvements that we had asked for – including a nice pond on the side of Building 27 and the addition of a small putting green behind Building 25. There will now be four entrances and 5 exits in and out of Hillcrest to help the traffic flow. The City Commission voted unanimously to move forward to the next reading.

At the March Hollywood Chamber of Commerce breakfast, our new Hollywood Police Chief Tomas Sanchez presented the 2015 Hollywood Police Department Annual Report; outlining the manpower, strategies and technologies that are being used to keep us all safe. The more I meet and see how our City Officials conduct themselves, the more I think how lucky we are to live in Hollywood. Our city is probably in the best place we have been in a long time. If we can continue beautifying the areas we develop and keep the view blocking buildings to a minimum, continue to make our streets and neighborhoods safer and manage our money wisely, we can truly call Hollywood the Crown Jewel in the Gold Coast.

Can't Get Documents From Your Condo Board?

I have had no fewer than FIVE phone calls from residents in five different buildings call Inside Hillcrest because they thought the article about condo misbehavior was about their building! That is very sad to me. Their biggest complaint was frustration at trying to get documents from the board that they, as owners, have a right to review. But upon further conversation, I figured out that the way they are requesting them is the reason they are not getting what they want.

First of all, do not request piles of documents that you do not really need simply because you want to aggravate them as much as they aggravate you. If it is a money issue, you know that asking for ALL the checks for the past seven years, is going to include legitimate expenses which will probably not going

Hillcrest Redevelopment Update with Concord Wilshire

Reported by Jeffrey Ladner, Building 11 President, Chair of Hillcrest Presidents Council, Current member of Hillcrest Legal Committee, and Candidate for City Commissioner – District 6

On Wednesday evening, April 13, 2016, Concord Wilshire and their team presented a redevelopment update to the Hillcrest presidents. This development consists of developing townhomes and single-family homes on the old Executive Golf Course and the current 18-hole Golf Course along with the Hillcrest Country Club.

Presidents or representatives from Hillcrest Buildings 1, 3, 5, 6, 8, 9, 11, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 and 27 as well as a representative from Washington Palms were present and informed of where the project currently stands and were allowed to have questions answered by the partners of Concord Wilshire.

Steve Sirang of Concord Wilshire, announced the legal lawsuit filed by some Hillcrest residents has been settled and dismissed.

The final Hollywood City Commission meeting for approval will be on May 18, 2016. Should the City Commission vote to approve the project, the final step in the process will be to obtain State of Florida approval in Tallahassee. Should the City of Hollywood approve the project on May 18, then allowing for any appeals period, the remaining disbursement of the \$3-million dollars will be available to Hillcrest buildings before the end of June 2016.

The 18-hole golf course is projected to be shut down on June 30, 2016. The Hillcrest Country Club facility will continue operations until the end of April. After that, a light menu will be served Tuesdays through Sundays until the golf course closes.

The site-plan presented on Wednesday to the Hillcrest presidents, is very similar to the project as presented almost a year ago to the Hillcrest community. The current changes to the site plan, which were required by the City of Hollywood include:

- Entrance/Exit onto 52nd Avenue from new HOA
- Exit only onto Pembroke Road from new HOA
- Exit only on service road leading to Washington Street near Hillcrest Nursing and Rehabilitation center from new
- Improved intersection on Hillcrest Drive leading to South Park Road.
- Round-about at the current 4-way stop intersection located at 52nd Avenue and Washington.
- A small golfing area incorporated into the park area will be available to all residents. To incorporate this golfing area, and to allow for more green space, some planned single-family home sites have been converted to townhomes. But still only 645 units will be built.
- The charter school playground will be relocated behind the current school (agreement between Concord Wilshire and Tobin)

Concord Wilshire responded to many questions and concerns of the gathered presidents and representatives. Hillcrest residents can be assured that Concord Wilshire will continue to work with the community to ensure this project is completed timely and effectively with minimum disturbance to existing Hillcrest residents.

Some noted areas of concern were the nesting owls. The developer will follow state rules and regulations to ensure nesting owls are protected and not disturbed. Dust will be mitigated by spraying of water on surfaces to avoid airborne dust from construction. The project will commence on the old Executive Golf course, including home construction, park and other amenities. Construction will commence on the 18-hole golf course presumably starting from the west side moving east with soil mediation, park and home construction being done concurrently as work progresses east. However, the park will be completed before any home on the 18-hole golf course receives a certificate of occupancy. The developer also listened to ideas and suggestions on unifying the Hillcrest community with the new development with signage, lighting and landscaping.

There will be a meeting of the presidents only on Tuesday, April 19th at 6:30 p.m. at the Hillcrest Presidents Council Clubhouse Two for discussion and selection of a new legal committee to oversee the process going forward.

to tell you anything you don't know. The March IH article suggested that the owners ask for copies of all checks made out to attorneys and their property manager, since they knew that is where the money went. From that point they could then request an accounting of what the corresponding legal issues were to prove their charge of malicious and/or frivolous spending. Also, because they were told that a former board member was the association's "legal adviser", they should also ask for copies of any checks issued to that owner as well as his license to practice law in Florida. If he took any money while he was on the Board, this would also be a violation according to their by-laws. (Of course, if the attorney paid him directly, it will be hard to prove.)

Unfortunately, unethical boards use the owner's money to pay unethical attorneys so they can stall or stonewall the owners when their actions are questioned. The Ombudsman office is overwhelmed with complaints and owners resent having to pay for an attorney to challenge board violations of by-laws and often, basic human decency. Especially in

our over-55 buildings, the number of owners who are brave enough to buck the system is low; boards can use their power to make people's life miserable; from harassment to taking away their rights to the common areas. "They can't do that!!!" you may say. Oh yes they can if no one stops them. Apathetic unit owners are as dangerous as a bad board.

If you want to prove money missing, you need to know where it went and then find the evidence. Any owner can request to see copies of the checks in question and either take pictures of them or be prepared to pay for copies. The request must be made in writing with some type of delivery confirmation so to prove when it was received. Owners are entitled to inspect the records within 10 business days of the request receipt. If the association does not allow inspection within the 10 working days, the owner is entitled to \$50 per day up to a total of \$500 for the association's failure to give access to the requested documents.

Try this: if you can get 10 or more owners to request the documents in writing, losing \$500 times that number of unit owners can get expensive; hopefully it will wake up the neighbors.

Experience Matters

Submitted from Commissioner Linda Sherwood Hello everyone. Remember Me? I'm the person who has represented you in City Hall for the last 9 years. By all accounts from residents in Hillcrest and around the city I've done a pretty great job. I think everyone knows my past history but just so there will be no confusion here it is again.

I've lived in Hollywood for 54 years and in District 6 for 16

years. I know every nook and cranny of Hollywood and Hillcrest and have worked tirelessly for all. I began gaining experience in all different areas making me a well rounded leader many years ago. I began as Mother of The Year on the board of directors of the Driftwood PTA. From there I helped write the Driftwood Master Plan and in so doing was the spark that turned the Recreation Center and ball field into one of the best Community Centers and ball fields in Hollywood. As the secretary for

the Driftwood Civic Association I initiated Driftwood's newsletter which became so popular it was mailed to more than 5,000 households. Sales and Marketing became my specialty until 1983 when I felt called into nursing. I considered this a ministry to which I was being called and consequently won a full scholarship that allowed me to become a Magna Cum Laude Registered

Nurse certified in Oncology. With this call to service of others I became highly enhanced in listening and complex problem solving.

In 1996 I was asked to help in a city commissioner's campaign in Hollywood. At that time there were no districts. Candidates ran citywide so it was here where I learned about every nook and cranny in Hollywood. One of the nooks I encountered was Hillcrest where I met and became great friends with dozens of Hillcrest residents. So much so that I performed in the old Hillcrest

Follies for several years in a row with so many wonderful people some of whom have sadly already passed away.

Now the city candidate that I have just mentioned went on to become a State Representative who hired both myself and my husband. There we worked for 8 years and it was through this position I gained expertise in government. During this time while working for the state rep. I was appointed as Chairperson for the City of Hollywood's Master Plan on Economic Development and Redevelopment. On this committee I learned the potential for Hollywood then and in the future.

In 2000 my family moved from Driftwood to Washington St.

and it was that same year that districts were put into place. So here I was now an official resident of District 6. While still working for the state rep. I was appointed to the Board of Directors of the Master Association of the condos in which I lived. Here at Beverly Hills we have 24 buildings and over a \$1.5 budget. I became very acute in budgeting. In 2008 after being encouraged to run for commissioner, I did so and won this office. I have diligently worked for and protected Dist. 6 while knowing that all of Hollywood was now under my purview. The lists of issues for which I have intervened on behalf of Dist. 6 residents including Hillcrest is endless. I return calls and emails and obtain results within 24 hours. My days and evenings are filled with meetings, phone calls, emails, workshops, executive sessions, the formal commission meetings, emergency meetings, CRA meetings and a multitude of events which a commissioner attends in order to listen to people's needs and show support. The most valuable meetings any commissioner attends are Civic Association meetings and I attend each of the 6 community meetings in Dist. 6 each month. When The Hillcrest Leadership Council was regularly meeting I never missed even one meeting.

When the Charter School for Hillcrest came into play I intervened on parking, site plan, timing of drop off and pick up hours reviewed the traffic plan, had multiple meetings with the developers and residents. When the old 9 hole golf course project tried to come on line I stopped the tennis courts below Bldg. 26. As we know the downed economy stopped that one. But with the new Concord Wilshire project the same effort has gone into the multiple meetings with their team. My first question to them was in making sure the \$3,000,000 from the old project would make it into your hands. I have made sure of multiple ingress and egress sites were included. Made sure the charter school playground would be moved so Bldg. 16 would not be so heavily impacted with noise. I have reviewed all traffic patterns, where new red lights will be installed, how the entrance from Park Road will be widened. A few years past when outside mail boxes were being pilfered I made sure extra police rounds were being done to deter these thieves. There is so much more I could list but this letter to you is long enough. Hillcrest, I have been there for you all along. Working hard to protect your best interests and I will continue to do so until 2020 if I can again ask for and count on your vote on Nov. 8 2016 for me Linda Sherwood, your commissioner and friend.

Uber Launches UberPOOL in Broward County

On Tuesday March 29th, Uber South Florida launched UberPOOL. UberPOOL takes the idea of carpooling and merges it with Uber's ridesharing technology. I had the honor of taking the first Uber-POOL in this market, and I think that this has tremendous potential to connect the residents of Broward County to the many fixed route options for mass transit.

The reason is that UberPOOL helps to find more riders along your route that can join you, which both brings down the overall price of the ride, and helps to ease the congestion on our roadways. If fewer cars can help more

people, everybody wins.

What's more, I know many people throughout South Florida are desperate to leave their cars at home. Yet, when we ask them why they don't take advantage of services like Tri-Rail or BCT fixed bus routes, they bring up the complicated logistics of driving to the station, or the stop, then finding a place to park, then having to navigate from their last stop to their destination.

UberPOOL can be one of the ways that our residents can make it easy and affordable to leave their door and go straight to mass transit, with the knowledge that they can also make it the last mile to whatever their destination may be

The big takeaways from this meeting were that Broward County is ready to begin the process for a full renourishment project to bring the shoreline back to where it was in 2007, after the completion of the last beach renourishment project. Plus, the Sand Bypass Project, which will collect sand at the north side of the Port Everglades entrance, in order to replenish the sand that erodes more quickly at John U. Lloyd State Park, is in its final phase of permitting.

Ahhh, love is in the air as Spring approaches "Our Backyard". The pond in the old nine-hole golf course behind Buildings 26 and 27 is teaming with romance. on or simply thought the Egyptian Geese were too noisy for neighbors. (sound familiar?)

Swimming two by two were American Coots. These comical looking mid-size water birds have round black/gray bodies, small black heads and white bills. My favorite water fowl are the Blue-winged Teals. The female duck is brown with just a bit of teal blue showing when her wings are folded. The male is the same brown with a beautiful teal blue head that has a white patch circling a black beak. When they fly, the wings display a beautiful blue area between the body and the tips. Not to be outdone are the Purple Gallinules with their candy corn

beaks, our pair of Pied billed Grebes all in tans and beiges and the little Green Heron that walks on top of the water. Other visitors to the pond have been a Great Blue Heron, a Great Egret, a Little Blue Heron, an American White Pelican. a Least Bittern and a few Anhingas. Seeing the Anhinga is a real treat. While fishing all one might see is the long neck poking up (hence its nickname, Snake Bird). The Anhinga is often seen sitting on a log or branch with its wings outstretched in the sun. I had a "surprise" encounter with the Least Bittern. It may not be a newcomer since it hides itself so well in the rushes. I was watching

A Cautionary Tale for Florida Homeowners

By Charles (Chuck) Rubin

An out of state homestead exemption can void a Florida exemption. Florida exempts a portion of a Florida homestead from ad valorem tax. This could save a taxpayer a few hundred dollars a year. The real economic value to such an exemption is that under Florida's Save our Homes provision, ad valorem tax value increases are limited to 3% per year even though the value of the residence increases more.

A husband owned a residence in Indiana. He received a residency-based property tax exemption from Indiana on that property. His wife owned a Florida residence and received a Florida homestead ad valorem tax exemption. In August 2006, the Broward County Property Appraiser caught wind of the dual exemption filings. It trotted out Article VII, Section 6(b) of the Florida Constitution, which reads "not more than one exemption shall be allowed any individual or family unit or with respect to any residential unit." Based on that provision, the appraiser sought to remove the homestead exemption from the wife's property for 1996 through 2006 - this uncapped the value for ad valorem tax purposes by removing the 3% Save our Homes protection.

Does the Constitution provision apply if the second exemption property is in another state? Yes, says the appeals court.

Is it unconstitutional to deny the wife her exemption because her husband sought exemption in another state? No, says the appeals court.

It is with great pride that I share the Hollywood Police Department Annual Report for 2015. This report provides a snapshot of the department's accomplishments. This year marks the 90th anniversary of the Hollywood Police Department. The long, rich history, combined with tremendous strides achieved by its members, has

I am pleased to report the City of Hollywood had an overall 18% reduction in Part I Crime for 2015 compared to 2014. Every Part I Crime had a decrease except

motor vehicle theft. To combat motor vehicle thefts, we are conducting operations utilizing mobile license plate readers, which have produced an increase in arrests for auto theft of 48%. The members of the Hollywood Police Department have worked hard this year, as indicated by the crime report and an increase of 38% in self-Initiated activity by officers.

As we stand on the shoulders of those who have come before us, we will face challenges which our predecessors never faced. There has never been a time in our history where collaboration is so necessary in order for us to resolve community issues and problems. But, resiliency has always been a hallmark of the Hollywood Police Department and we will continue to persevere. I look forward to our continued progress.

The City of Hollywood just celebrated her 90th birthday. Our new Chief has been in office less than a year and several new programs have been established that stress a proactive methodology through intervention techniques. Offender Intervention, Crime and Disorder Intervention, and Preventative Measures are the focus for the future.

Street Crimes and Vice, Intelligence and Narcotics

The Street Crimes Unit and the Vice, Intelligence and Narcotics (VIN) Unit collec-

tively address street-level crimes such as prostitution, narcotics, robberies, burglaries, and violations which reduce the quality of life in a neighborhood. These units may engage in sophisticated undercover operations to reduce organized narcotics trafficking, vice crimes, racketeering, money laundering and street level drug sales.

Uniformed Patrol

Uniformed Patrol is the backbone of the Police Department and follows the Department's Community Oriented Policing and Problem Oriented Policing philosophies. Patrol includes three districts – East, West and Beach. Patrol Officers responded to 129,864 calls for service in 2015. They self-initiated 60,012 police actions, including 3,278 arrests and 11,518 traffic citations. Neighborhood Problem Solving Teams, including permanent zone assignments were also implemented.

Crime reduction and quality of life strategies with Special Operations included: 415 fewer residential and business burglaries in 2015 from 2014, which represented a 29% reduction; 21 fewer robberies in 2015 from 2014, which represented a 12% reduction; and 346 fewer motor vehicle burglaries in 2015 from 2014, which represented a 21% reduction. Uniform Patrol also includes a canine unit.

Traffic Unit

The Traffic Unit investigates

motor vehicle crashes and conducts traffic enforcement in crash-prone areas and areas where complaints are Special Operations received. The Traffic Unit is also responsible for the orderly flow of traffic in the City. The Traffic Unit includes Motors, Hit and Run Investigations, and Traffic Homicide. Several traffic initiatives and operations were conducted in 2015 included partnering with the National Insurance Crime Bureau to combat auto insurance fraud. We established citywide multiagency DUI saturation patrols. Operation Speed Bump began in November 2015 and is ongoing. It is proving to be effective against DUI, narcotics trafficking and aggressive driving.



Investigative Services

The Investigative Services section is responsible for the investigation of homicides, robberies, sexual assaults, child abuse, domestic violence, animal neglect and abuse cases, as well as property crimes such as burglary, arson, theft, and fraud. Detectives assigned to this section are highly skilled investigators who have earned their positions by demonstrating the knowledge, skills and abilities crucial to being a successful investigator.

In addition to their regular case load, the Special Victims Unit monitors sexual offenders and predators. They also work with multiple agencies by participating in the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force.

Property Crimes Unit

The Property Crimes Unit handles a vast array of crimes throughout the City to include: Burglaries, Grand Thefts, Felony Vandalisms, Auto Thefts, and Economic Crimes. We welcomed the Economic Crimes Unit back to the PD in 2015.

Crime Scene Investigation

CSI is responsible for the collection, documentation and processing of all physical evidence needed to successfully investigate crimes through photography, physical crime scene searches and the recovery of DNA and latent fingerprint evidence. Crimes Scenes attended: 3,679. Scenes processed: 1,507. Scenes with latent recovery: 874. DNA Hits: 64.



they chose to go hire an internal City Auditor and providing opinions and experiences. Several cities are now utilizing an internal auditor to prevent costly budget errors. Whether it is financially feasible or not is a question that seems to answer itself in light of our history here in Hollywood. Obviously, we would be in a better financial position today had we had the services of an internal auditor over the past 10 years.

Fort Lauderdale Mayor Jack Seiler and City Auditor John Herbst were very informative and engaging. In a nutshell, the City Auditor is responsible for reviewing all budgetary expenses, contracts as well as any items that any of the City Commissioners or Mayor are concerned about. The City Auditor is there to monitor and advise to make sure the city expenses are legal and justifiable. I really liked

the idea of having someone internally who wasn't in (as they said) a "gotcha" position but rather someone whose job it is to support the Commission, the City Manager and City Attorney. That when someone had an idea or concern, even if it was out of sync with everyone else, there was an independent advocate to investigate and let him or her know if they were on the right track; or if not, explain why in a private environment. I like the idea of making people feel safe when they sincerely want to challenge the status quo. And of course the goal is to save so much money that the position does not end up costing the City more than we would save.

Of course our city Commissioners did not agree on whether or not the idea was good enough to put on the ballot for the voters to decide; which is always a good sign. Nobody wants a cookie-cutter board who always agrees with each other on everything. Two Commissioners showed that they took the time actually do some research on the position with other cities (Pembroke Pines and Delray Beach) prior to the meeting. Both knew how other cities had handled implementing the position. One Commissioner admitted she needed to do some research before proceeding further. One asked the intelligent questions about the importance of the ballot language taking into consideration future needs if the City Auditor position became a reality. At least two Commissioners were against the idea and both cited a real concern about current budgetary shortages and said that maybe this was an expense for later on down the line. It is estimated that the initial hire would cost the City about 250K per year.

The issue was tabled until the next Commission meeting. Hopefully, ALL the Commissioners do their homework before the next meeting and vote to allow the people of this city to decide for ourselves in November whether or not we want a City Auditor to watch over our budget. The City Auditor position would be on par with the City Attorney and City Manager and although the Commission would be in charge of the actual hiring, hopefully these two gentlemen will have a say in who is hired. Their input would be invaluable not only because they would be working closely with whomever is hired but also because the Commission's hiring history has not been great for the past few years.

Ironically, a couple weeks after that Commission meeting the Sun Sentinel wrote an article about Ft. Lauderdale's City Auditor, John Herbst reporting the same problem to their Mayor and City Commissioners about unauthorized spending for temporary workers. The amount was under 400K so this to me is a great argument FOR hiring a City Auditor. If we had discovered the problem before it reached the \$973K mark, it would have paid for two years of a City Auditor. In Fort Lauderdale, the Director of Sustainable Affairs, a 158K per year position, was let go as a result of the report.



 - Ensure your needs and wishes are met

The Five Wishes are:

- 1) The Person I Want to Make Health Care Decisions for Me When I Can't
 - 2) The Kind of Medical Treatment I Want or Don't Want
 - 3) How Comfortable I Want to Be
 - 4) How I Want People to Treat Me
 - 5) What I Want My Loved Ones to Know

Steps to Complete the Five Wishes:

1) Obtain the form; you can download it or call and order at:

https://www.agingwithdignity.org/five-wishes.php

- 2) Complete the form with the help of family, friends and physicians.
- 3) Sign the form in the presence of TWO witnesses of whom one is NOT a spouse or a blood relative the form does NOT have to be notarized in the state of Florida (if you are outside of Florida, check with your state)

Once you complete the form:

- 1) Talk to your medical surrogate or health care agent, physician, family members and others who care about you. Give them copies of your completed form.
- 2) Keep the original copy in a special place in your home.
 Tell your family and/or friends the location. Do NOT put it in a safe deposit box.

the Anhinga and it just sort of hopped out at me. It breeds on fresh water marshes and so we "may not see" some baby Least Bitterns if all goes well. The Least Bittern is about 10 -12 inches tall. It is brown and black with white stripes on its chest and wings.

On the "grasslands", flocks of White Ibis have been keeping the bug population down. The brown ones amongst them are juveniles. They will turn white as they mature. The Black Vultures and Turkey Vultures continue to fly over our buildings (hope no one is too sick). As unpleasant as one may think of vultures, they are beautiful in flight. As they soar, one sees wings that have feathers on the ends almost like fingers. The black vultures have whitish/bluish feather tips and the Turkey Vultures have gray feather tips all around the wing. The Turkey Vultures have a red face that also distinguishes them. A real thrill was seeing a Sharp-shinned Hawk or it may have been a young Cooper's Hawk. Both birds have a spotted brown breast with blackish feathers. Another predator was an American Kestrel seen in that big tree across from Building 22. Kestrels are smaller hawk-like birds. Let's hope our predators stay with us. As Spring brings all the baby rats, mice, rabbits and squirrels, our predators will need "treats for their young". Have you noticed fewer pigeons? Hey it's not cruel, it's Nature. Think of it like "humankind and the

chicken". Some creatures are meant for food.

Our songbirds are forever serenading us each dusk and dawn. My binoculars are not powerful enough to see all the distinguishing marks of our bird chorus. We have a variety of sparrows and swallows. The more colorful friends are Monk Parakeets (lime green), Scarlet Tanagers, Cardinals and Blue Jays. On lower branches or the ground are our American Crows, Common Grackles and Mockingbirds. When my sister, who is an avid Birder, was visiting, she saw a Red Bellied Woodpecker, a Crested Caracara (ya really want to Google this one) and the Brown Thrasher.

A few weeks ago, I was speaking to some Naturalists that work in Everglades National Park. The excessive rain and warm temperatures up north are disturbing migratory bird patterns to a degree not seen before and with consequences unknown. Birds rarely seen are making their way here. Some of our common migratory birds are appearing, or not, off schedule. The amount of rain in our usual dry season has shifted the growing patterns of plants and the mating/hatching pattern of some insects. In Nature, timing is everything. If the young are born too late, they may not be mature enough to survive migration. It's important that the insects swarm about the same time the fledglings need to be fed. Plants need to be readily available for nesting, grown enough to hide the young and flowering or seeding at the right time. It is predicted to be a difficult time for birds and other animals. Who knows if we will ever see these "snowbirds" again. For now, get out into Our Backyard and enjoy the splendor that awaits us there.

No Car? Uber and Seniors

MARCH COMMISSION NOTES

The March 2 meeting may have been the shortest one in the modern era. We were out in two hours. Items were routine. My comments are at the end of this report.

March 2 CRA meeting. Approved their annual budget. Worth noting that refinancing of debt resulted in a savings of \$3 million. Director Camejo updated us on



downtown occupancy, business retention, and tenant

The CRA Downtown Master Plan has been introduced and will be rolled out in sections, beginning with the April **Blattner** 6 CRA meeting. Mr. Camejo concluded that cities with the

most vibrant downtowns are those that feature entertainment and dining.

Students & Government. 65 South Broward High School students, led by Senior Class Advisor Ashley Lehman, attended the March 16 meeting. It was awesome that at least six students filled out cards and spoke on an issue, which they did intelligently and respectfully. I speak for the entire Commission when I say we loved it. McArthur students are coming in May.

Approved final plans for new 300-space parking garage at Nebraska St. on the beach.

Discussion regarding Internal Auditor. To hire or not to hire? (alas per Yorick!) At the April 20 meeting we will decide whether to put this on the ballot in November. More to come.

Here's a biggie. Two or three years ago, we made a commitment to purchase a software system for the Building Department. Sadly, it was not going to work and our smart new IT professional (whom, by the way, I really like) bit the bullet and asked to cancel the contract. Initially he estimated it would cost \$400,000 in penalty payments, but he negotiated and the vendor agreed to cancel-and refundroughly \$85,000 in unused fees. It may not sound like it, but that's a big win, all the way around.

Commission Comments. These were my comments and suggestions:

• I commented very favorably on the report prepared by Phil Rosenberg, the ultimate HR professional, now retired. At the City Manager's direction, he interviewed those employees identified in the County Inspector General's report. As a

result, some staffers have left their jobs.

- We are discovering more and more illegal conversions. Old timers would be amused because they have been complaining about these for years. My colleagues agreed with my recommendation for a staff analysis and recommendations on how to address this issue.
- Once again, I asked for a status report on the proposed updating of our city's dumpster ordinance, which currently only applies to the beach and downtown. One look at the parking lot behind Il Posto and you'll easily see why Commissioner Calleri and I are on this. Our original request was made last June.

Just a thought. Why do we keep sending money to places that advocate death to America?

Healthy Delicious Alternatives to our Favorite Junk Food That Taste Just as Good!

Psyche! There aren't any. I love mashed cauliflower as an alternative to mashed potatoes but they don't taste like mashed potatoes and do not belong on top of my Shepherd's Pie. I can enjoy turkey meatloaf and turkey burgers but no, they do not taste like ground beef. You can keep your quinoa; but I think almond milk beats regular milk any day of the week. In our spare time, of course, we think about creating an alternative to



Brian's Chocolate Covered bacon; hey - we do what we can. If I printed a recipe for mozzarella served on whole grain

toast with tomato, egg, parsley, seasoning and canola oil, people would think it was healthy. The following recipe has the same ingredients. So why wouldn't it be just as healthy? You tell me...

FRIED MOZZARELLA STICKS

1½ cups shredded mozzarella

½ cup grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese

1 large egg beaten

2TBS minced parsley (or use a TBS tubed parsley)

½ tsp each of crushed red pepper, salt and black pepper OR 1 ½ tsp Slap Yo' Mama (found at Boodro's house or at Penn Dutch)

10 slices of your favorite healthy whole-grain bread with the crusts cut-off.

Large skillet filled with 1" canola oil.

Marinara sauce or your choice

- 1. Mix both cheeses together with the egg, parsley and seasonings. Refrigerate while you go to the next step.
- 2. Flatten each slice of bread with a rolling pin (or a tall glass bottle will work) as thin and evenly as you can get without tearing. With the long sides facing you, spoon 1 heaping tablespoon of the chilled cheese mixture on the lower half of each slice. Brush the edges with water and rollup the bread around the filling. Then press the seams and open ends together to seal and refrigerate again until oil is hot.
- 3. Heat the oil to 350 degrees. Fry the rolls in batches, turning occasionally until crisp about 2 minutes. Transfer to paper towels to drain. Sprinkle with your favorite seasoning (we like garlic salt) and serve with sauce.

SURINAM CHERRY SEASON IS HERE

I think it because I was in the restaurant biz for so long, that I ALWAYS wear gloves when handling food – especially ground meat that can be affected taste-wise by the oil in your hands. I went to dinner at a friend's house that not only did not wear gloves but constantly licked her fingers while cooking. I just kept telling myself that the germs would get cooked out, ate little and never went back.

It is April and our favorite home-grown cherries should be in full bloom any day now. Although the only the very red or purple cherries are the sweetest to eat, a few orange-colored ones when making the jam gives a more zesty flavor. Year after year I find an easier way to process them. Pitting them is really tough – they spray everywhere because they are so soft and they stain everything. You have to wear gloves. A cherry pitter doesn't work on soft cherries so here is a way to make them firmer and easier to pit. This little tip will make it easy to use a cherry pitter (but you still have to wear gloves – they will stain your hands):



INSIDE HILLCREST'S ANNUAL SURINAM CHERRY JAM RECIPE

(Easy but time-consuming and SO worth it!)

Immediately place the cherries in a deep pot filled with ice-cold water (overnight is best) so any debris floats to the top. Skim off the debris and drain cherries very well. Pour them into a shallow baking pan and partially freeze (about an hour). Remember that these cherries are so delicate they will wrinkle and go bad within days even in the fridge so don't pick them until you have the time to process them. However, we do pick out the biggest and juiciest and freeze them in snack bags. We eat them like healthy little popsicles and they last for months in the freezer.

- 1. Using the cherry pitter on the now firm cherries, pit them placing the cherries in a pot and discarding the seeds.
- 2. Heat pot to medium and add sugar (about $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar to every 3 cups cherries). Boil and stir until almost all juice is boiled out. Cool and put in jars.

- 3) Make sure your physician puts the fact that you have a Five Wishes document into your medical record.
- 4) Keep a copy of the Five Wishes in your automobile; also bring a copy if you go to a hospital, nursing home or assisted living facility. Ask that it be put into your medical record.
- 5) Create a list of the people and places that have copies. Finally, keep in mind that laws and procedures change. If you have a specific question or issue, talk to a licensed medical or legal professional for advice and guidance.
